

## CHAPTER VI. ELECTIONS

### Article 1. City Elections

---

#### ARTICLE 1. CITY ELECTIONS

- 6-101. ELECTION OF GOVERNING BODY. On the first Tuesday in April 1983, there shall be elected a mayor, two councilmen from each ward in said city, and a fifth councilman to be elected from the city at large. In each ward there shall be designated positions of councilman number 1 and councilman number 2. Those officers elected to the position of councilman number 1 and the officer elected from the city at large shall hold their respective offices for a term of four years. Those officers elected to the position of councilman number 2 and the mayor shall hold their offices for a term of two years. On the first Tuesday in April 1985, and every four years thereafter, there shall be elected a councilman for the position of councilman number 2 and there shall be elected a mayor all for a term of four years. On the first Tuesday in April 1987 and every four years thereafter, there shall be elected a councilman for the position of councilman number 1 and a councilman for the city at large, all for a term of four years. - 6-102. CONDUCT OF ELECTION. The election of city officials shall be conducted in all respects as provided by the laws of Kansas governing the holding of city elections. (K.S.A. 25-2101 *et seq*; Code 2014)
- 6-103. HOURS OF VOTING. At all city elections the polls shall be open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m., unless different hours are set and publicly announced by the county election officer. (K.S.A. 25-2111, 26-206; Code 2014)
